The Five main factors accounting for the most recent housing loss in Winnipeg are:

Low income (32.6%)
Eviction (16.9%)
Substance use (16.3%)
conflict with spouse or partner (14.0%)
Discrimination (10.8%)

Respondents identified the following supports as most needed to help them exit

homelessness:
affordable housing
financial support (rent subsidies, higher EIA rates, and lower housing cost), mental health and substance use services.
